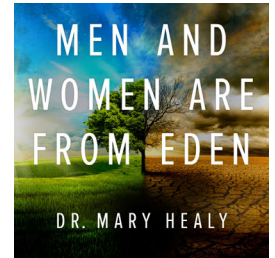

MENTORS FOR ENGAGED COUPLES MINISTRY

Couples that are planning to be married at Holy Family participate in a marriage preparation program. There are many facets to this program, including teaching about the Theology of Marriage, attendance at a Pre-Cana retreat sponsored by the Archdiocese, Natural Family Planning classes and planning the liturgy for their wedding. Another component is the taking of the Marital Inventory. Sometimes this is referred to as the "compatibility test" but in reality it is simply an inventory of many of the important aspects of marriage to make sure that couples have had discussions about these important topics. The review of the inventory results is normally done by "Mentors for Engaged Couples." They meet with the engaged couple 2-3 times to facilitate a conversation between the bride and groom around these important topics.
